Surinder S. Jodhka has worked extensively in the areas of Political Sociology; Social and Cultural Identities in contemporary India; Development Studies; Social Stratification; Rural Society and Agrarian Change. He has been Professor of Sociology and Chair, Centre for the Study of Social Systems at the School of Social Sciences, JNU since 2006. He was awarded the 2012 Amartya Sen Award for Distinguished Social Scientists by the Indian Council of Social Science Research. In his illustrious academic career he has been awarded with prestigious positions. He was the Indian Council for Cultural Relations Professor at Lund University in 2012. He was also an Honorary Fellow at the Indian School of Political Economy in Pune, and during the period 2008–2010, he was the Director for the Indian Institute of Dalit Studies. For five years he was Country Coordinator for the Religions and Development Research Programme, coordinated by University of Birmingham, UK. He has been a Charles Wallace India Trust Fellow at Queens University in Belfast; South Asian Visiting Scholar at University of Oxford; Honorary Visiting Fellow at University of Wisconsin, Madison; and Visiting Associate Professor at University of Bergen, Norway.
